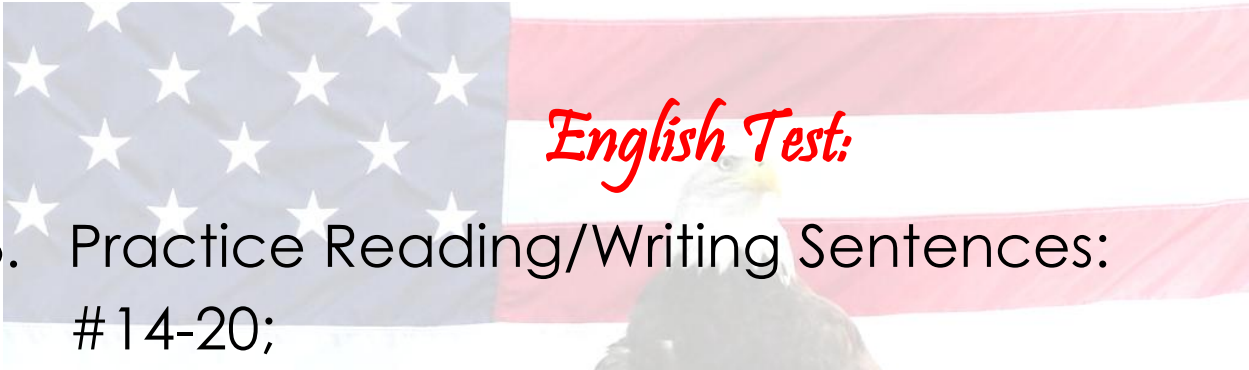

Additional – more;

Claim – say or tell;

Hereditary title – title that goes from generation to generation (from parents to children);

Order of nobility: King, Queen, Prince, Princess, etc.;

Legally incompetent – does not understand anything;

Mental institution – place for mentally sick people;

Confine – restrict/limit (cannot leave);

Overdue taxes – late taxes;

File a tax return – send a form that shows how much money you made and how much taxes you paid;

Non-resident – not a U.S. resident.

Member – supporter, follower;

Purpose – function, goal, intent;

Communism – Government controls everything (law, industry, property, health care, education, etc.);

Totalitarian party – party of total control;

Terrorist – kills people for political reasons;

Advocate – support, propagandize;

Overthrow the government – change or replace the government;

Persecution – discrimination, harassment;

Paramilitary unit - a group of civilians organized in a military fashion;

Self-defense unit - a group that uses self-defense as an excuse to kill;

Vigilante unit - a group of self-appointed doers of justice;

Police unit - a group of people who work for a government to catch people who break the law;

Extermination camp - a place where a lot of people get murdered;

Concentration camp - a place where large numbers of people, especially political prisoners or members of persecuted minorities, are imprisoned, sometimes to provide forced labor or to await mass execution;

Prisoner of war camp - a jail or prison for enemy soldiers or other military during a war;

Labor camp - a jail or prison where the prisoners have to do a lot of difficult work;

Transit camp - a camp for the temporary accommodation of groups of people, e.g., refugees or soldiers, who are traveling through a country or region.
